We appreciate that giving your pet the best care can be expensive. With this in mind, at the end of September we are very excited to be launching our new Pet Health Club.



New Leishmania Vaccine

If your pet travels abroad you should be aware of Leishmaniasis. This is a debilitating, life threatening disease that can cause your pet many problems. The disease is caused by a parasite that is passed on by biting sand flies.



It is mostly seen in Southern Europe although can be seen further north. Until recently the only prevention

was by using **Advantix** and **Scalibor collars** to repel the sand flies. The good news is that there is now a vaccine available to protect your pet on holiday. The course is three injections two weeks apart and your dog will be protected 4 weeks




after the last vaccinati on. So if you are taking your dog into an at risk area you will need to plan ahead to make

sure they are protected.

Leishmaniasis is a horrible disease. Don't take the risk.

New Services

We will shortly be receiving our new video endoscopy unit. This is a camera that we can use to look inside the patient. It is especially useful in looking at the stomach, intestines and airways of cats and dogs.



If your pet has been vomiting or has eaten something it shouldn't have we will be able to look inside and see what is going on. If your pet has swallowed a foreign body we may be able to retrieve it without putting him through an operation. We will also

be able to perform biopsies of the stomach and small intestine in a much less invasive manner resulting in a quicker recovery for the patient. We had a recent case of Meg an 8 yr old Staffordshire Bull Terrier who has developed a few nasty gastric ulcers. She had an operation to look inside the stomach and biopsy the ulcer in case it was cancerous. The biopsy results were suspicious of a tumour. She was then put onto medication for a month. After this time Meg came back to the practice



and underwent endoscopy to see how her stomach wall was healing. We were

delighted to see that after a month of treatment the stomach wall had fully healed. There was no sign on any ulcer or tumour. This was great news for Meg's owner which we could not have known without the endoscopy.

It's That Time of Year Again



As we creep into Autumn we head towards firework season. The key to relieving your pets stress is planning! Here are 3 top tips:

- 1) Provide a den or covered area where your pet can feel safe.
- 2) Products such as Adaptil and Feliway can be used in the home to help relieve your pets stress. They are pheromone products that make your pet feel calmer and more secure. They come in several forms but the diffuser is useful to plug in

near your pets hiding place



3) Also, don't give them lots of attention if they are stressed as you will be rewarding this behaviour and encouraging it. This is hard to do, especially as they will be looking to you for reassurance. Just act as though there is nothing to worry about.

Further Advice

- 1) Ask your vet about other medications that are available.
- 2) Close all windows, doors and cat flaps to reduce chances of escape.
- 3) Provide extra litter trays for cats.
- 4) Provide distractions eg. new toys and chews. Draw curtains and put on the TV to mask the noise.
- 5) DO NOT punish your pet. It will just make them more stressed.
- 6) Try not to leave your pet alone when fireworks are going off. Your pet may hurt themselves during this time.
- 7) Walk your dog when it's light.
