

How do I set up a mailbox using IMAP on my device or mail client?

If Animal Oracle is hosting your email use the following instructions to set up a mailbox using IMAP on your devices.

By using an IMAP connection, you can have one or multiple email client programs simultaneously connected to the same mailbox. For example, you can have email on your phone, your tablet, and your computer, and when you delete a message from your phone, it will also be deleted on your other devices.

The way your device or mail client is designed may be different than how other programs or devices work, with different names for the same steps.

For our Desktop/Laptop users we strongly recommend using the Mozilla email client called 'Thunderbird'. It can be downloaded from here: <https://www.thunderbird.net/>


Here are general pieces of information you need to complete the process.

- Incoming Mail Sever Details:
 - Server Type: IMAP Mail Server
 - User Name: Your full email address.
 - Password: Your provided mailbox password
 - Server: Either **imap.extendcp.co.uk** or [mail.yourdomain.com] change to match your domain eg mail.animaloracle.com
 - Port: **993**
 - Connection Security: SSL/TLS
 - Authentication Method: [Normal] Password
- Outgoing Mail Sever Details:
 - Server Type: SMTP
 - User Name: Your full email address.
 - Password: Your provided mailbox password
 - Server: Either **mta.extendcp.co.uk** or [mail.yourdomain.com] change to match your domain eg mail.animaloracle.com
 - Port: 465
 - Connection Security: STARTTLS
 - Authentication Method: [Normal] Password
